Transmission of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV)

HIV can spread when a person does not take medicine and HIV is detected on blood tests. HIV can be passed on to another person when blood, semen, vaginal or rectal secretions meet damaged tissue. HIV can be passed on through the lining found inside the rectum, the vagina, the opening of the penis, or the mouth. Women living with HIV should not breastfeed. Women who are pregnant may pass HIV to their unborn children unless they seek treatment. HIV treatments work. Ask your primary care provider team for more information.

Protect yourself and protect your health.

HIV, or Human Immunodeficiency Virus, lives in the cells of your immune system. Your immune system helps keep you from getting sick. HIV takes over these cells and uses them to make more HIV.

When HIV moves into your immune system, your immune system does not work as well. This means you can get sick more often. That you can have trouble healing from sickness. If HIV is not treated with medicine, you can get sick with AIDs. Luckily, people who take medicine for HIV can live a long healthy life and not get AIDS.

AIDS stands for acquired immune deficiency syndrome. When you take your HIV medicine daily you will not get AIDS. AIDS only happens when the immune system is weak. People with AIDS get serious infections and are very sick.

The viral load.

A viral load refers to how much HIV is in the blood. Taking your medicine every day will help keep your viral load low. You will have many lab appointments to measure your viral load. If your viral load is low, your medicines are working. If your viral load is high, your medicine is not working. Your provider might change your HIV medicine. There are many kinds of HIV medicine.

Not taking your medicines may increase your viral load. You could pass HIV to others if you do not take medicines. Decide with your provider what you should take. Then stick to the plan prescribed. Not taking your medicines the right way can make the HIV virus resistant. Resistance means your HIV medicines don't work well anymore. Your immune system may weaken, and you might get infections or other problems. Ask for more information.

Know that treatment works

Focus on reliable sources. Look for stories about real people from across the United States talking about how sticking with treatment helps them stay healthy. Stories on how they protect others and still do what they love.

How To Tell Others About Your Diagnosis

Telling is scary. Plan first. [Parkland](#) will refer you to Health Department counselors should you need help. Health Department Counselors can also tell for you upon request. HIV medical treatment works should your partner or partners test positive. Treatment will work for you too.

Why should I tell

You deserved to know and now they deserve to know. Plan to tell anyone you had unprotected sex with. Also, plan to tell your partner or partners you shared drug injection “works” with. Drug partners might have been exposed, just like a sexual partner or partners. They deserve to know and get tested. Tell that you are living with HIV, break the chain. HIV treatment works.

Telling your partners

Say: “I tested positive for HIV.”

Do not say: “You infected me with HIV.” or “I’ve given you an STD.”

Do not say: “You have HIV.” People can be exposed to STDs without becoming infected.

Say: “I want you to get tested.”

Three ways to inform your partners

1. You take on the responsibility. You tell about possible exposure. You encourage testing.
2. You provide your partners’ names to the health department. Your partners are located and made aware of their exposure by health department staff; the health department does not use your name. Your partners are provided services by the health department.
3. You let your partners know of their exposure with trained help. Health department staff are with you during the process. They provide information on counseling, testing, and other resources.

Remember:

1. You can’t control your partner’s response, but you can control your own behavior. You can stay calm. Reactions will happen. Then be ready to answer questions.
2. Think before you begin. If you think this is going to be too hard, use trained professionals who can inform your partner without letting the partner know anything about you. Ask your case manager to help you make a plan.

I want to tell, but I don't know how

- **How:** Make a plan. Focus on the facts. Write down what your partner or partners might say. Think about what you would want to say in response. Avoid accusations and confessions. Use language that is kind and thoughtful. Imagine several ways your partner or partners might react to the news that you are living with HIV. Expect a reaction. Many feel ashamed and embarrassed. Do not be. A chronic disease can be managed. HIV treatment works.
- **When:** Choose a time to talk when you can have complete attention. When you both have time to focus. The sooner you tell, the sooner your partner or partners can get checked and treated.
- **Where:** Choose a place that is quiet, private and safe. You do not want interruptions. You do not want to be overheard. If you are unsure about your safety, ask a Health Department Counselors to tell or tell with you.
- **Bring:** Information about local anonymous and free testing.

Common questions others may have:

Did I get HIV?"

Answer: "Possibly. There is really no way to know until you get tested."

"Did you give me a disease?"

Answer: "I don't know who had this first. I only know that I tested positive and we've had sex; that means you should see a provider and get tested."

"Where did this come from?"

Answer: "I don't know. Either of us could have had this for a while without knowing it. That makes it pretty hard to pin down where it came from."

"But I don't have any discharge, burning, sores or rashes, so I don't think this has anything to do with me."

Answer: "I'm glad you are not in pain, but that doesn't mean there isn't something going on. I care about you and I really want you to be okay. The only way to be sure you are is to go to the clinic and get checked out."

"What if I don't have it?"

Answer: "Parkland offers PrEP. PrEP is a pill that prevents HIV infection if you may be exposed to the virus. [Parkland](#) will help you get started."

"What about you?"

Answer: "I am working with a case manager. I am educating myself and working towards becoming U = U. In about six months with medication, the virus will not show up on blood tests. Soon, I will be U = U which means my viral load is untransmittable. I will manage my chronic disease. I will be ok."

PrEP Talk

What is PrEP?

PrEP stands for Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis. PrEP is a pill that prevents HIV infection if you are exposed to the virus. It only works if taken every day. PrEP is made up of two anti-HIV medicines. PrEP can decrease your risk of HIV.

Before starting PrEP:

Talk to your provider about the benefits of PrEP and whether PrEP can help you. Your labs will be checked before starting PrEP. You will be tested for: HIV, Hepatitis B, sexually transmitted infections, and kidney function. You can only take PrEP if you are HIV-negative and have normal kidney function. Some patients who take PrEP have upset stomach, decreased appetite, or a mild headache. These are often mild and go away within the first month.

Starting PrEP:

You and your provider will decide when you should start PrEP. Your provider will prescribe PrEP for 3 months at a time. Men take PrEP for 7 days and then they are protected from HIV. Women take PrEP for 20 days before protected from HIV. Plan to use condoms before and after starting PrEP. You are still at risk for other sexually transmitted diseases.

Monitoring on PrEP:

You will see your provider every 3 months while on PrEP. The checkup includes a discussion on side effects. A test for your kidney function. Follow up tests for HIV and other sexually transmitted infections. The repeat tests make sure you do not have a new exposure. Contact your provider right away if you have fevers, throat pain, muscle aches, rash, or swollen glands.

If I take PrEP, can I stop using condoms?

You should always use condoms while on PrEP. PrEP does not keep you from getting other sexually transmitted infections. Talk with your partners on how to stay protected.

Can I start and stop taking PrEP?

At each visit, talk to your provider about your HIV risk. Talk about whether you should keep taking PrEP. If you decide to stop taking PrEP, please talk to your provider first.

Testing in the community

Getting Started or Returning

You deserve to be as healthy as possible. Your primary care provider wants to support all your care needs. At [Parkland](#) primary care providers work as a team to support you. The primary care provider may be a:

- Doctor
- Nurse Practitioner
- Advanced Practice Provider

Remember, you play an active role in your healthcare needs. Your primary care provider will answer your questions. And ask how you feel about the care plan. Together you will decide and then stick to the plan.

Just recently diagnosed or returning to care?

Case managers help people with medical care in and outside the hospital. Case managers help you stick with your decided care plan. At first you might want lots of support. Later you might not need as much. Know that options are available. Plan to check in twice a year to renew your financing.

Own your center

You are at the center of your health plans. It is important that you play an active role in your healthcare. Find your old medical records. This will give your team a more complete picture of your health.

Ask lots of questions.

It is essential that you understand your care plan. And that the plan has your input. The decisions you and your primary care provider make impacts your health and quality of life.

Understand tests.

Find out what tests are for. How the test will help you. A positive HIV test means you have the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). The test does not tell how long you have had the virus. Or how sick you might be. Your primary care team will explain before tests begin. Then tests will gather information on your overall health. Tests will focus on the condition of your immune system.

1) Call a Ryan White agency

To connect or reconnect to the HIV/AIDS care system, simply call one of the Dallas County organizations listed on pages 20. Organizations have "RW" (Ryan White) beside the agency name. These local organizations can either provide you with services or connect you to an agency that can.

2) Ask a Ryan White agency about the health insurance marketplace

The Affordable Care Act known as Obamacare created healthcare exchanges known in Texas as the Health Insurance Marketplace to help people find health insurance coverage. Let us help you find coverage. Call a Ryan White organization **listed on page 20** that has “RW” (Ryan White) beside the agency name. Tell the person who answers the phone that you want to speak with someone about signing up for health insurance.

You can also sign up directly at any Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC). These agencies get funding from the Health Resources and Service Administration to care for eligible people. These centers may also be called Community Health Centers, Migrant Health Centers, Health Care for the Homeless, or Health Centers for Residents of Public Housing. All Federally Qualified Health Center have staff trained to help you. You do not need to be a patient at that clinic. Please contact the following and ask for more information.

3) Tips and Instructions for eligibility

Establishing your eligibility:

Each agency in the Community Services Handbook has specific eligibility requirements. Different requirements might include things like your health status, where you live, or how much money you make.

What to bring with you:

Take the following items when you seek new services. The following items may be helpful to have with you for the eligibility process:

- Proof of your diagnosis of HIV;
- Proof of where you live;
- Proof of your income; and
- Proof of your insurance status if you have insurance

There are times when you may not have the information required. If this is your situation, call an agency and ask to speak to an intake specialist. They will offer helpful advice on how to find items you need to bring.

IMPORTANT: Talk to the staff at the agency before you visit. Find out exactly what items or papers are needed for your appointment.

REMEMBER: Call ahead to the agency to ask what items you need to bring. Keep all your papers in the same place. Take these papers to each new agency you visit. Some agencies may work together. If they work together, then you might only go through the process once. However, many agencies will ask you to repeat the eligibility process. Try not to get frustrated. Keep our papers in one place and take them with you as you seek new services.

4) Common Questions

Can I bring someone with me?

Yes. A support system is important. Involve loved ones in your care and support. Invite your support team to your telehealth visits. Contact your primary care provider team in advance if you require someone with you during a clinic exam. [Parkland](#) is working to keep everyone safe during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic.

There may also be services for affected family members. Services like counseling or childcare for your children. Referrals to other community services may be helpful to you, your caregivers, partners and family members.

What happens to my information?

Information provided at the intake session is entered into a Texas Department of State Health Services database called ARIES. ARIES information is secure and confidential to protect your privacy. It is used to track the HIV epidemic, the needs of the people affected by the disease and the services they use. All Ryan White funded organizations must enter this information and keep strict confidentiality. What you share is private. Only you can provide permission for us to share information with other providers.

A copy of all the forms you complete will be given to you. You will be given a folder or packet to keep your papers. Take the packet to appointments outside of Parkland. Parkland may refer you to other referral service organizations. With your permission, Parkland shares needed information with referral service organizations. When you agree, the information shared helps the process along so you can begin services quick.

What happens next?

Immediate referrals: You will receive immediate referrals to needed medical care or supportive services. Just complete the required paperwork and questions. Your intake team will help you to make your first appointments. The team will clarify other paperwork you may need.

Referral services: You will receive a form of all supportive services during your first visit. The intake team will help you with the first set of appointments. After that, a case manager helps with referrals. Case management may be a service you use for a while.

Referral packets: Keep your packet of paperwork together. Bring your intake packet to new agencies you visit. Use a case manager to access more referral services. You can request case management now, or years from now. Call when you need to find services.

National Partners With Ryan White Agencies

Achieving Together Texas

Texas adopted the national Achieving Together initiative to reduce new HIV infections by 50% at an annual rate by 2030. Texas can achieve this goal when 90% of people living with HIV know their HIV status, 90% of those who know their status are on antiretroviral therapy (ART), and 90% of those on ART achieve viral suppression. <https://achievingtogethertx.org/>

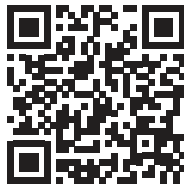
